D.A. McMahon: Domestic Violence Bureau Chief, Tuesday Muller-Mondi Awarded Prestigious Thomas E. Dewey Medal by New York City Bar Association

Award is presented annually to outstanding prosecutors in New York City

Staten Island, N.Y. – Richmond County District Attorney Michael E. McMahon today announced that Assistant District Attorney Tuesday Muller-Mondi, Chief of the Domestic Violence Bureau, was awarded the 2017 Thomas E. Dewey Medal by the New York City Bar Association yesterday evening during a ceremony in Manhattan. The award is presented annually to outstanding prosecutors in New York City.

“Congratulations to ADA Tuesday Muller-Mondi on being awarded this year’s Thomas E. Dewey Medal for her exemplary work with this office. Under Ms. Muller-Mondi’s leadership, the prosecutors in our Domestic Violence Bureau have thrived, as she and her team work hard every day to hold criminals accountable and make Staten Island safer,” said **District Attorney Michael E. McMahon**. “Together we created a dedicated Domestic Violence Bureau for the first time on Staten Island, and have implemented a host of initiatives such as vertical prosecution, precision prosecution with the new Family Justice Center and the creation of electronic orders of protection. This lifelong Staten Islander has devoted herself to keeping the most vulnerable safe and she is most deserving of this award.”

Tuesday Muller-Mondi was named the office’s first Domestic Violence Bureau Chief in 2016. Under that role, she and a Deputy Bureau Chief oversee a team of eight ADAs dedicated to prosecuting domestic violence cases. She began her career with the Richmond County District Attorney’s Office in April 2005, and formerly served as its Deputy Chief for Special Victims Bureau. She supervised and handled all aspects of felony prosecution related to child abuse, sexual abuse of adults and children, domestic violence, including misdemeanors, elder abuse, and abuse of members of vulnerable populations, including homicides. Under her role as Deputy Chief, she also served as liaison for various outside agencies including the Mayor’s Office to Combat Domestic Violence, Community Health Action of Staten Island, NYPD Special Victims Unit and Sexual Offender Monitoring Unit, Office of Mental Health, Safe Horizon, ACS and SICAC. Muller-Mondi also headed a pilot project entitled Domestic Violence Electronic Monitoring Program, and serves on various committees and task forces, including the Sexual Assault Task Force, Mayor’s Office U-Visa Subcommittee, and Mayor’s Office Subcommittee on Trafficking Victims in New York City. Prior to that, she worked as Acting Deputy Chief for Supreme Court Bureau from April 2011 to September 2012. From June 2010 to April 2011 she worked as Deputy Chief for Criminal Court Bureau, and was also a Complaint Room

Supervisor in Criminal Court from April 2005 to June 2010. Prior to coming to the Staten Island DA's Office, she worked in the Bronx DA's Office for five years.
